Clontibret Community Games provides various sporting activities and opportunities for young people through participation in areas, counties, regional/provincial events and through our national finals twice per year.

- Activities: The activities are divided into two categories individual and team. Individual events include Art, Model Making, Gymnastics, Swimming, Athletics track and field events- specifically Hurdles, Ball Throw, and Long Jump. Team events include Badminton, Basketball, Camogie, Chess, Choir, Draughts, Debating, Futsal, Gaelic Football, Handball, Hurling, Rounders, Rugby, Tag Rugby, Soccer (Indoor & Outdoor), Table Tennis, Table Quiz, Pitch & Putt, Variety and Talent Events!

Section 2 - Principles to safeguard children from harm

 means that adults should have a basic understanding of the emotional, physical and personal needs of
 young people.
- Integrity in relationships Adults interacting with children in sport are in a position of trust and influence. They should always ensure that children are treated with integrity and respect, and the self-esteem of young people is enhanced.
- Fair Play All children's sport should be conducted in an atmosphereof fair play. The principles of fair play should always be emphasised, and organisers should give clear guidelines regarding acceptable standards of behaviour.
- Quality atmosphere & ethos Children's sport should be conducted in a safe, positive
- · and encouraging atmosphere.
- Competition Competition is an essential element of sport and should be encouraged in an age appropriate manner. A child centred ethos will help to ensure that competition and specialisation are kept in their appropriate place.
